

## **Rules:**

- **Each player draws one card at random. The player with the highest card will go first.**
- **The host will read the clue. Players will “buzz in” by raising one card from the top of their deck. In the event of a tie, the player with the highest card will be considered the first to buzz in.**
- **You must wait until the clue is read in its entirety before “buzzing in”.**
- **The host will recognize the first player to buzz in. As in the official Jeopardy game, all responses should be given in the form of a question.**
- **A correct response earns the dollar value of that clue and gives that player the right to select the next clue.**
- **If the player gives an incorrect response or fails to answer in time, one half that amount is deducted from his/her total, and another player may “buzz in” to attempt to answer the question.**
- **If no correct answer is given, the host will read the correct response and the player who originally chose the question will remain in control of the board.**
- **4-5 players will compete in each round with the winner from each round plus the next two highest scoring players continuing to Final Jeopardy.**
- **For Final Jeopardy, players will record their wagers after hearing the topic, but before seeing the clue. Once the clue is read, players will have 30 seconds to write down their solutions. At the end of 30 seconds, players will reveal their solutions one at a time, starting with the player who has the lowest score. Scores will be tallied and the highest scoring player wins.**
